CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2016

Since the last AGM, Birkdale and Beach Haven Community Project (BBCP) has continued to provide a 'community house' for our communities to connect and gather in. From April 2015 to March 2016, Beach Haven House welcomed 11,060 people and Birkdale House 12,633 people. This showed us that the community spirit that grows from the classes and activities is immeasurable.

BBCP remained true to the belief that robust community; celebrating community; building community; community projects and events are essential to the development of resilient, safer and well connected communities.

Writing my report gives me time to reflect on the years' work, review our progress, look at the challenges and successes, and do this with an eye to the future. BBCP celebrates the fact our team have achieved considerable positive outcomes over the years. Our team, volunteers and user groups' ability to continue to serve and celebrate community through programmes, activities and events has helped strengthen BBCP's connection with the residents and communities of Birkdale and Beach Haven.

Through the houses we facilitate many events and work in collaboration with our partners, key stakeholders, local schools and local business community. Our highly successful involvement as partners with Kaipatiki Community Facilities Trust in coordinating the Kapahaka Matariki Festival, among many other events, was a highlight. In March we focused on "Celebrating Communities Beach Haven Birkdale" where we supported our community to put on over 28 events. The "Drive for Blankets Project", which featured in the North Shore Times, was greatly appreciated by recipients. This amazing project had overwhelming support from the community and many local families were grateful to be gifted blankets that will keep them warm for many winters to come. We were also proud to be an event partner at the grand opening of the Opaketai Beach Haven Garden, which was a community-led placemaking project.

All of these events and projects enhance our focus on engaging with people, connecting residents to each other, and facilitating processes and pathways for connected neighbourhoods that can create a positive future together. BBCP seeks to promote opportunities for community to come together, participate and feel valued.

Over time, BBCP has seen the changing dynamics of communities and it was established that there was a need to rejuvenate the project to ensure we are still meeting the needs of the community. The key areas of focus are needs analysis, evaluating our fit and house programmes, and an opportunity to have a dialogue with our communities. We have used this community input to build our strategic direction going forward.

Establishing this new direction and a need for rejuvenation led the committee to promote Carla van Walen to an enhanced management role and appointing her to head the strategic review. This included a focus on engaging community for input, encouraging staff teambuilding and looking for better opportunities for professional development for the team. Carla's ability to adjust to and lead the changes has been highly valued.

In this review, John highlighted the need for additional funding for BBCP. John's support and ability to resolve the issues at hand constructively with the team is deeply appreciated.

Finally, I would like to say a special thanks to our board members who have contributed their time, support and commitment to rebuilding stability in BBCP governance and the project overall. Their voluntary help through the years and wise counsel on governance work is appreciated.

The Committee is looking forward to building a meaningful strategic plan to guide BBCP to deliver and fulfil community goals and aspirations into 2017 and beyond.

PROJECT MANAGERS REPORT 2016

We are incredibly proud to have welcomed over 23,693 people through the doors at both of the community houses over the 2015/16 year. With more than 80 groups plus one-off hirers, we are happy to confirm the Community Houses are a hive of activities for all ages and cultures.

Not only do we provide warm and comfortable places to meet, learn, share and promote wellbeing, we continue to respond to the changing needs of the communities of Beach Haven and Birkdale. Over the last year we have supported many families and individuals using our extensive networks to gather food, clothing, Christmas decorations, blankets and furniture to help alleviate isolation issues and build confidence.

We are continually listening to the community and provide new groups, classes and events as there is a need. With over 1300 hours donated, our volunteers

are a key part of BBCP. Without the work that our volunteers do we could not do what we do in our communities.

BBCP has either partnered or led more than 35 events in the past year. The team at BBCP believes that supporting our community to participate in events that are relevant to their interests is essential to continuing the growth of a proud and connected community! We thank our number one event partner, Kaipatiki Community Facilities Trust, for their ongoing support and shared passion for community development.

As the Project Manager, I have been asked to complete a Community Needs Assessment, which will feed into a strategic review; this will enable us to have clear direction and a strong and relevant operational plan.

To ensure that activities and facilities are directly related to the needs and wishes of the Community and that there is a continuing opportunity for expression and identification of those needs, and that priorities be established on this basis.

Every time I think about the development of 136 Birkdale Road, I feel so grateful to be involved with a project that is going to give a community a hub in which to connect, share and learn. This is an amazing, sunny, elevated space with the potential to offer our unique community so many options to grow. The vision is to have a space in which our community can enhance their skills in relation to becoming more environmentally conscious. 136 will be a place where people can share skills, working spaces, outdoor messy work areas, a kids' mud kitchen, community gardens, fruit forests, a playground that is naturally challenging and fun for all ages, and a space that can enhance the life for those in our community with special abilities. Our community will have the option to be involved with this development though the "Birkdale Place-Making Group". We look forward to this development starting to take shape in January 2017.

THE KIDS AT #134 REPORT 2016

Over the last year our kids' programme has seen an increase of children, most of our holiday programme days now being fully booked within a week of being released and attendance at our after-school care has increased to the point that we now need to increase our licence limit. With this increase, the programme has finally been able to become self-sustaining and no longer relies on the community houses to fund the programme.

We have had several highlights over the last year, one being a donation of \$5000 from Martin Henderson; this money made it possible for us to upgrade our resources, sports equipment, books and games. The money also made it possible for us to plan some extra professional development for our staff and to purchase a tablet so we can capture memories within the programme.

We are very fortunate within our programmes to have a wonderful team of staff who consist mainly of youth, and this is a great opportunity for youth in our area to gain work experience. We also have a great team of supervisors and an intern who have been able to hold the fort as needed throughout the year. We are very grateful for them and hope they know they are the driving force behind the success of the kids' programmes.

The next year is set to be another great year; bring on 2016/17!
